

## Logging into Google Classroom: A quick guide by Ms Lovelock

In class, we have recently started using Google Classroom. Some children have asked to access their Google Account from home, and I may occasionally set home learning tasks on Google Classroom, so I have produced a quick guide for how to access the platform at home.


Your child should have their Google Classroom login details in the back of their Reading Record. If not, they should ask me in school and I can provide them with what they need.

The screenshots I have used in this guide are taken from a phone screen, so may look slightly different if you are accessing the internet on a different device. However, the instructions should still apply.

### Some tips before you start:


- Passwords are case sensitive – so make sure your child knows if their password includes capital letters or not.
- If you have problems viewing content, try switching to using the Google Chrome browser (available to download for free).
- Download the Google Classroom app if you are using a tablet.
- **Before you start following the instructions below, ensure you are logged out of any other Google accounts, as you will not be able to access the Cedar Class Google Classroom through any account other than your child's school account.**

### Instructions



1. Go to [google.com](https://google.com)

Select 'sign in' at the top of the page.



2. You will then be redirected to a page which looks like this. Type in the email address provided by school (inside cover of blue book).

3. You will be redirected to a page which looks like this  
Type in the password provided by school (back cover of Reading Record). Don't forget capital letters.

4. You will be redirected to a page which looks like this.  
The first letter of your name in the top right of the screen will show that you are logged in.

5. Now go to [classroom.google.com](https://classroom.google.com)  
The page should look like this.  
Click on Cedar Class.

6. Click on 'Classwork' towards the top of the page to see what I have posted for pupils to work on.
